Proclamation

WHEREAS:

More than 9 million Americans have gout, which is caused by uric acid

build-up in the joints and the most common form of inflammatory

arthritis; and

WHEREAS:

Gout is a chronic disease characterized by sudden and excruciating

painful attacks impacting a person's workplace, community, and daily

quality of life; and

W HEREAS:

Black Americans are two to three times more likely to develop gout than

white Americans, and are less likely to be prescribed urate-lowering

medications or to receive ongoing, routine provider care; and

WHEREAS:

Asian Americans and Asian Pacific Islanders are also at an increased risk

of gout; and

WHEREAS:

Stigma, lack of awareness, and misinformation may hinder treatment for

gout; and

WHEREAS:

Public awareness can reduce the unfair stigma people with gout

experience and empower patients to seek quality care and timely

treatment.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TIM WALZ, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Monday, May 22, 2023, as:

GOUT AWARNESS DAY

in the State of Minnesota.
